Course Description: This class will examine both the political and social history of the United States from Reconstruction of the nation after the Civil War to the Great Depression.

Units of Study: The following topics will be discussed in this class-

1- Civil War and Reconstruction 4- 1920s

2- Westward Expansion, Immigration, Industry, and the Progressive Era 5- The Great Depression

3- America as a World Leader

Required Materials:

1- ChromeBook 2- Internet access 3- Writing instrument 4- 3 Ring Binder

Grading:

- 1- Formative Checkpoints 20%: Students will complete daily checkpoints for a grade. The checkpoints will be graded for correctness.
- 2- <u>Summative Assessments 50%</u>: Students will take a unit test at the end of every unit covered. Each assessment will have multiple choice and essay questions.
- 3- <u>Classwork & Class Participation 30%</u>: Students are expected to complete all assignments. This is a way for those who do not perform well on tests to bring up their grade. Students will receive class participation grades on a daily basis. This means students are paying attention, taking notes, watching the video, working on assignments, NOT PLAYING ON CELL PHONES or CHROMEBOOKS.

Grading Update: A new category will exist in Infinite Campus grading this year. This new category for grading is used to track an individual student's growth through the educational standards developed by the state in each content area. By adding this category into infinite campus, it allows both parents and students the opportunity to see student mastery of standards in each content area and will count as 20% of each students' quarter grade. Students will still be assigned traditional grades, ranging from 0-100 points, but this additional component will intentionally target specific state standards, allow for student support before the end of unit assessments, and visibly record progress for student and parent awareness. When standard progress is tracked it will be scored on a number system of 1-4. A score of 1 is a novice, a 2 is an apprentice, a 3 is proficient, and a 4 is distinguished. Again, students will still receive a traditional grade out of 100 along with a corresponding letter grade of A,B,C,D, or F for each class. This new category will simply allow students and parents to see a student's growth through a standard of content.

Late Work: I do not accept any late work for full credit. All late work MUST be submitted BEFORE the assessment is taken in the unit in which the work was assigned.

Cheating will not be tolerated! Cheating includes the obvious, such as plagiarism, copying, looking onto another's test, doing half a worksheet and swapping with someone for the other half, using cheat notes, but it also includes giving information to others for tests. Cheating earns you a zero.

- <u>Start of Class</u>: All students are expected to be in the room when the bell stops ringing. If a student is not in the room when the bell stops ringing, he/she will be counted as tardy unless the student has a note from a teacher. Studewill log into their Chromebook and begin working on the bell ringer.
- <u>End of Class</u>: Mrs. Hollon will announce when to put away materials. Students stay seated until the bell rings to go to the next class. Students will NOT be allowed to gather at the door due to social distancing rules and regulations. This will be strictly enforced.
