Course Description- This course will introduce you to a wide variety of psychological disorders and theoretical concepts that underlie them. You will learn the presenting symptoms, criteria, possible causes and treatments for each disorder discussed.

Units of Study- The following topics will be discussed in this class:

*Concepts of Abnormal Behavior *Dissociative Disorders *Eating Disorders *Somatoform Disorders *Schizophrenia *Developmental Abnormalities *Mood/Affective Disorders *Anxiety Disorders

*Substance Abuse Disorders *Personality Disorders *Somatoform Disorders

Required Materials:

Grading:

- 1- Assessments 50%: Students will take a unit test at the end of every unit covered. Each assessment will have multiple choice and essay questions.
- 2- Homework/Classwork 25%: Students are expected to complete all assignments. This is a way for those who do not perform well on tests to bring up their grade.
- 3- In Class & NTI Participation 25%: Students will receive class participation grades on a daily basis. This means students are paying attention, taking notes, NOT PLAYING ON CELL PHONES, CHROMEBOOKS, and attending Google Meets. If Google Meets are required, students are expected to participate just as if they are in school. Students will receive participation grades for NIT for completing assignments, logging onto MANDATORY Google Meets when scheduled, attending small group activities when able, and responding to emails and messages.

Late Work: I do not accept any late work for full credit. All late work MUST be submitted BEFORE the assessment is taken in the unit in which the work was assigned.

Cheating will not be tolerated! Cheating includes the obvious, such as plagiarism, copying, looking onto another's test, doing half a worksheet and swapping with someone for the other half, using cheat notes, but it also includes giving information to others for tests. Cheating earns you a zero.

General Class Information:

- *Cell Phones*: Students are not permitted to access their phones during class unless it is an emergency. Students will not be allowed to use phones to complete assignments due to each student having a ChromeBook.
- Start of Class. All students are expected to be in the room when the bell stops ringing. If a student is not in the room when the bell stops ringing, he/she will be counted as tardy unless the student has a note from a teacher. Students will log into their Chromebook and begin working on the bell ringer.

- End of Class: Mrs. Hollon will announce when to put away materials. Students stay seated until the bell rings to go to the next class. Students will NOT be allowed to gather at the door due to social distancing rules and regulations. This will be strictly enforced.
- Seating Arrangement: Due to COVID regulations, students MUST sit in assigned seats. This is not an option.
