Welcome to Piano Lab! The Piano Lab class is a self-paced class designed for students who are either seeking to start learning the piano OR who are seeking to build upon previously learned skills and abilities. Students will also engage in the study of music theory and music history. Students will progress at their own pace, with guidance from their instructor.

Piano Lab Expectations

- 1. **Be excellent to each other.** I expect no less than common courtesy to be extended to one another. Be respectful of each other, as you will be playing the piano in front of your classmates and learning at different paces.
- 2. **Be prepared.** Failure to prepare on your part does not constitute an emergency on mine, and since this is a self-paced class, you will not lack for anything to do in the class. I expect you to be fully prepared for each playing test and grade update.
- 3. **Be on time.** Please make sure to take care of all of your business before coming to the lab.
- 4. **Be responsible with the use of your personal tech devices.** Because of the independent and self-paced nature of this particular course, it is imperative that you make use of the technology available to you in order to be successful. However, be advised that inappropriate use of your personal tech is an entirely different matter. You are in class. Act like it.
- 5. **Be aware that food and drinks are not prohibited in the vicinity of the pianos.** This is to protect the piano lab equipment. You are absolutely welcome to stash water bottles on the countertops if you like.
- 6. **Cell phone use is a privilege.** There will be days that I allow you to use your phone to look up songs or do assignments, but you must be on task. You will put your phones in the phone caddy when you enter the room and I will let you know when you can use them.
- 7. **Participation is also based on attendance.** You can't participate if you are absent, therefore your daily participation grade (5 pts/day) will be a 0 when you are absent. It is YOUR responsibility to let me know if you have turned a note in that will excuse your absence. Participation points will not be added for unexcused absences.
- 8. **This class is about progress, not perfection.** Do your work, come prepared and ask questions!

Must-Have Supplies

- Something to contain any papers you will receive/keep your point sheet in (folder, binder, etc.)
- Pencil we only ever mark in the book with pencils.

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 Headphones/earbuds (bear in mind that Bluetooth headphones are not compatible with my current piano lab technology and therefore cannot be used with the lab pianos).

Piano Lab Learning Opportunities and Grading

You will have several opportunities to be graded in the piano lab. Grades will be given in accordance to the school grading scale.

Performances

- o <u>Piano Point Sheet:</u> Throughout the duration of the trime, you will accumulate points from the piano point sheet, which will serve as the majority of your grade in this course. Each exercise in the piano books carries a certain amount of points. Completion of a certain amount of points by the end of each grading period will result in a certain grade. You will find a comprehensive listing of songs and corresponding points attached to this syllabus. Mrs. Kahoun must sign off on each song/unit you play.
- o <u>Testing Out of Piano Units</u>: Each unit in the lesson books has a piece that you must perform in order to demonstrate mastery of the concepts of the unit. As you test out of each unit (done during your weekly lesson time), your performance will be graded according to an established 30-point rubric. While a perfect score of 30 is not a requirement to pass through the unit, you must obtain a certain score (minimum score of 3) in each rubric area (6 areas) in order to move on to the next unit in the book.
- o <u>Playing Tests</u>: Every Friday you will have a playing test, where you will play a song that you are on in the book for the whole class. You will be scored on a rubric based on your performance and preparation.

Projects

- o <u>Composition Project:</u> This project will allow you to take what you have learned at your keyboards and create your own piece of music.
- o <u>Comprehensive Piano Composer Biographies:</u> In this project, you will study the great masters of piano composition from various points through the ages.

• Other Assignments

o www.musictheory.net: Music theory is another essential component to achieving success in the study and practice of piano, and musictheory.net is one of the best, most user-friendly sites to help with the study of music theory. Students will complete music theory exercises on Tuesdays and Thursdays, with grades being based upon the percentage of correct answers per exercise.

A new category will exist in Infinite Campus grading this year. This new category for grading is used to track an individual student's growth through the educational standards developed by the state in each content area. By adding this category into infinite campus, it allows both parents and students the opportunity to see student mastery of standards in each content area and will count as 20% of each students' quarter grade. Students will still be assigned traditional grades, ranging from 0-100 points, but this additional component will intentionally target specific state standards, allow for student support before the end of unit assessments, and visibly record progress for student and parent awareness. When standard progress is tracked it will be scored on a number system of 1-4. A score of 1 is a novice, a 2 is an apprentice, a 3 is proficient, and a 4 is distinguished. Again, students will still receive a traditional grade out of 100 along with a corresponding letter grade of A,B,C,D, or F for each class. This new category will simply allow students and parents to see a student's growth through a standard of content.

What if I turn in an assignment late?

Late work will be worth 50% of the full credit score for two weeks after the original due date. After two weeks, the grade becomes a zero. Also, please email the teacher when you submit a late assignment.

Pass Policy (PLEASE READ THIS CAREFULLY!!!)

There will be occasions in which one must leave the piano lab for various reasons. When in doubt, please consult this page. My policies are as follows:

- Students will not be allowed to leave class during the first or last 10 minutes of class. It is up to YOU to manage your time and belongings in such a way as to get to your next destination. It is possible.
- Only one student at a time will be allowed out of the lab, unless otherwise specified by Mrs. Kahoun. You must fill out the sign in/out sheet and have the hall pass before you can leave.
- Restroom: If a trip to the restroom is needed while I am giving instructions, I will ask that you stay until all instructions are given. If the trip is needed during an in-class performance, I will ask that you wait to leave until the performance is finished. If restroom visits are needed on a regular basis at a certain time, a doctor's note needs to be provided, and the information provided on said note will be kept confidential between you and me.
- Other teachers' classrooms: In the interest of protecting everyone's learning/teaching time, please refrain from asking to leave the piano lab to work on assignments for another class.

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• Coming in Late: If you are not in the door of the Piano Lab by the time the bell rings, you are tardy.

What are the consequences for misbehavior in the classroom?

When you distract others from learning I take offense. As a result, the following consequences can be expected:

- 1. First offense: verbal warning and the behavior is corrected
- 2. Second offense: verbal warning, telephone call home, and a referral
- 3. Third offense: immediate referral to the office

If the behavior is a major violation of school policy – an immediate referral to the office

What if I choose to cheat on any of my work?

Cheating includes: copying another's work, looking onto another's test, or offering someone your work to copy. Cheating earns you a **zero.** This applies to online work as well.
